

Major in Social Welfare

► General Introduction

The learning objective while Majoring in Social Welfare is to provide students with the theory, knowledge and skills on the social welfare system and policies that are important for prospective professional social workers.

► Education Objectives

1. The Goal of Education : The study of social welfare aims to promote social justice, personal empowerment and freedom in order to intensify the well-being of the members of society. This is preceded by solving the problems existing between social issues and human relations all based on social change. To achieve this purpose, this department educates the student body to engage essential knowledge of social welfare allowing advancement to professional social workers who have the indispensable capabilities and intelligence for the job.
2. Explanation of the Goal : For the first year of this course, students have the opportunity for assessing various theories of social welfare and other areas related to social welfare. These undertakings are for developing a scientific and systematic analysis of growing complexity of social issues.
After the second year of this course, the curriculum will focus on training students as professional social workers by educating ethic, knowledge and method of social welfare practice.

► 02465 Introduction to Social Welfare

This course is an introduction to the perspectives, concepts and theoretical foundations of social welfare, including an analysis of the institutional structures of social welfare in the modern society. It aims to let students learn the basic knowledge of social welfare and social welfare practice, and help cultivate the ability to research and practice in a social welfare setting.

▶ **02178 Introduction to Sociology**

This course employs sociological perspectives to understanding society and its people and the inherent dynamic relationship. It also seeks to cultivate the ability to implicate the knowledge for intervening conflict between human relations and social problems.

▶ **02542 English Reading for Social Welfare**

This course provides students with a general understanding of social welfare terminology by engaging the literature on the establishment of social welfare in Korea as well as developmental influences on Korea by the United Kingdom and the United States of America.

▶ **02756 Social Welfare Organization Administration**

This course teaches the theory of administration and its application when managing and applying the knowledge and skills in practical social worker settings.

▶ **01899 History of Social Welfare**

This course is designed to understand the basic knowledge of social welfare policies by surveying foundation, progress, and contraction of social welfare in western society in terms of political, social, and economic views. It also explores the perspectives of development of Korean welfare by reviewing the social welfare issues in the context of our history.

▶ **01891 Human Behavior and the Social Environment**

This course will employ various theories and perspectives to understand individuals, families, group, organization and society in order to form the concepts and factors regarding the human behaviors in the context of the social environment. It provides students with basic knowledge of human development.

▶ **01892 Social Welfare Policy**

This course will offer students the opportunity to develop foundational concepts and paradigms in social policy and apply them in the real world. Analytic frameworks with regard to social welfare policies and services are presented.

▶ **01901 Social Problems**

This course explores the causes and effects of social problems. Through analyzing social problems, students will have capabilities to control and prevent such problems.

▶ **01908 Social Work in Mental Health**

This course provides foundation content on social welfare methods in working with individuals and their families adapt to and overcome challenges associated with mental illness. It will cover a wide range of mental health issues and intervention strategies.

▶ **01902 Child Welfare**

Child Welfare is an essential area of social welfare. This course will present knowledge and research on the development of children as well as factors that promote physical and mental health of children.

▶ **01931 Recreation**

This course will help students understand the general knowledge of recreation as a way of therapeutic

intervention. The definition, history, values, and purpose of recreation will be addressed. Students will learn first aid, counseling, music, sports, the folk games and so on.

▶ **01893 Theories of Social Work Practice**

This course is foundational course for methodology of social welfare. Through this course, students will learn practical procedures in social welfare settings pertaining to values, ethics, professional supports, interviews, and perspectives.

▶ **01896 Skills and Techniques for Social Work Practice**

This course focuses on various skills, techniques, and principles of social work practice that are important for social workers when working with a person and their family or as a larger group. Emphasis is placed on how to apply knowledge and skills in real social work settings.

▶ **01894 Research Methods for Social Welfare**

This course introduces general theories and methods of social research as applied to the social welfare and the social work practices. The techniques and basic concepts of statistics will be taught as a foundation of social survey.

▶ **01907 Social Welfare for the Disabled**

This course prepares students for understanding the range of disability issues they will encounter in social work practice and research. Throughout the course, students will learn theories, values, and skills necessary for supporting and working with people with disabilities. The course focuses on the enhancement of the quality of life of children and families with disabilities.

▶ **01920 Social Services for the Elderly**

This course provides a wide range of theories and perspectives on the social services provided for the elderly. The course teaches practical models and methods of intervention for effective social work practice in the elderly care.

▶ **01913 Social Services for Women**

This course will provide students an opportunity to gain knowledge of feministic approaches and issues that are relevant to working with women.

▶ **02935 Counseling Psychology**

This course will present contemporary knowledge and research on counseling psychology. It will focus on the development of practice skills and theoretical foundation of counseling.

▶ **01918 Social Welfare Administration**

This course examines the theoretical foundation and concepts of social welfare administration, and provides the knowledge and skills necessary for administration and management relating to social welfare organizations.

▶ **01897 Community Welfare & Practice**

This course aims to understand a wide range of practical process based on the community. The course will

focus on social welfare methods relevant for practice with communities, and utilize the generalist intervention model and practice skills.

▶ **02851 Case Management**

This course will provide an overview of case management. The skills and techniques associated with social work practice will be presented to support and manage the clients' needs. It also offers practical suggestions for both assessment and intervention drawing from person and the group.

▶ **01928 Social Work with Families**

This course aims to understand the family in modern society. The course will cover the family life cycle and varying family forms, engagement and assessment of families, selected intervention models of family therapy and related theories.

▶ **01927 Program Development and Evaluation**

This course provides the theory and practical skills of program development and evaluation of social welfare. The course aims to cultivate the capability of developing, managing, and evaluating the programs. Throughout the course, students will understand the whole process of program development.

▶ **01912 Data Analysis for Social Welfare**

This course is an introduction to the design and conduct of a research study, data collection and summarization. Students will be trained and assisted in some or all aspects of the following research tasks: literature review, data analysis, record-keeping, interviewing, report writing, data entry and coding, data collection, other tasks commonly founded in research problems in social welfare.

▶ **01924 Psychological Testing**

This course examines the human's characters by using systematized methodology. It will be useful for students to understand the personality, interests, intelligence, and aptitude of the person. The theoretical foundation and detailed skills of psychological testing will be addressed.

▶ **02173 Field Practicum & Seminar**

The field practicum provides learning opportunities for students to integrate and apply theory to practice and develop essential skills for professional social workers.

▶ **02934 Field Practicum and Social Work Supervision**

This course is an intensive course of Field Practicum and Seminar. A student has a choice of practicum within a range of settings related to her/his interest. The course is intended to help students apply and integrate foundation knowledge of social work skills, values, and ethics with practice. It also aims to understand the concept, function, and skills of super vision to be an effective supervisor.

▶ **02936 Community Social Work model**

Micro and macro intervention are the main ways of supporting the client in the community level. These two interventions are different from traditional problem-solving methods, because they are based on the community in which the client resides in. This course will examine the intensive knowledge, values, skills of intervention models needed to community practice, and intend to intensify capability of application in social welfare settings.

▶ **01910 Social Security**

This course will look into definition, position and history of social security in welfare states. It also explores the contents of social security between Korea and developed countries, and presents the effects and tasks of social security.

▶ **02545 Management of Volunteer**

This course is intended to promote the development of the capabilities of the volunteer programs, using volunteers in social welfare fields, as well as equipping students with necessary skills for managing volunteers.

▶ **02543 Information Systems in Social Welfare**

This course aims to understand the use and manage of information systems in social welfare, and to acquire systematic knowledge about development, embodiment, and maintenance of information systems. It involves the right and reverse functions.

▶ **01919 School Social Work**

This course will provide the knowledge about necessity, definition, policy, and method of school social work to dissolve the problems relating to students such as violence in school and delinquency. It aims to cultivate the professional social worker in the school environment.

▶ **01895 Social Welfare and Law**

This course is intended to help students understand the general knowledge of social welfare law. The concepts, values, purposes, foundation and strategies of social welfare law will be addressed. In addition, students will be expected to consider how to apply the knowledge and theory in practical settings

▶ **01925 Ethics and Philosophy for Social Welfare**

This course examines the foundation knowledge pertaining to social work ethics, philosophy, and values in the context of social welfare. Students will understand the necessities of other ethics, such as the ethics of clients, social workers, and society through discussions in the class. Throughout this course, students will develop their own ethics and values in regards to social welfare.

▶ **03152 Social Welfare Policy Analysis**

This course examines the relations among political, socioeconomic, and historical variables and social welfare through systematic study of welfare state. The course will consist of lecture and discussion about concept, history, develop and crisis, and type of welfare state.

▶ **01926 Industrial Social Welfare**

This course will present the impact of industrial social welfare, and analyze the substantiated as well as theoretical social phenomenon occurring in the industrialization of society. It will prospect the present and future situation of Korean industrial social welfare by studying state and welfare, labor welfare, and methodology of industrial social welfare.

▶ **02937 Topics in the major English**

By studying the original literature, students will gain an authentic knowledge base concerning the field of study. This course aims to develop basic English skills and expand terminologies.

▶ **02755 Field Practicum Education**

This course contains an intensive field practicum component and seminar. It will provide education and training for students to apply practical social welfare practice models and principals in the work setting. It aims to develop knowledge and skills necessary for work as a professional worker in social work setting upon graduation.

▶ **01911 Social Work in Health Care**

This course will examine knowledge and skills of social work in medical and health organizations specifically focusing on clients. Also students will learn psycho, economic, and social factors affecting clients and their family, and recent issues relevant to direct services and health care administration.

▶ **02547 Social Welfare Planning**

This seminar aims to explore the contents of program planning, management, and evaluation in order to deliver effective services. The class focuses on analysis and discussion on the cases related to entry, measure of needs, intervention strategy, perform and evaluation.

▶ **01932 Social Welfare Studies**

This course will examine foundation, methodology, policy and strategy, and issues related to social welfare, and look into research on theoretical and practical perspectives.
